IMPORTANT INFO FROM ALUMNUS:

I contacted **Bonnye Newby (82)** Spray and asked her to write an article about her mission to let everyone know the danger of talking or texting on cell phones while driving. Please read what she has to say.

When a child is born there is such a special and unique bond between the mother and child. My daughter Amanda was no exception. Not only was I a supporting factor in her life, she was the same in mine. Whenever I had a really rough patch in my life she was always there to make sure that I would be fine.

As a teenager we did have some rough patches but our love never did falter. Even after she moved out at the age of 18 she would call me every night before she went to bed along with numerous text messages throughout the day.

Amanda was in a car crash in 2006 while talking on the cell phone. Her vehicle rolled 3 times-she said it was not her time to die yet and the part of the roof that was over her head did not cave in. Amanda said "that is where the angel sat and I saw white envelope me before the vehicle rolled".

I can remember clearly with every detail including what I was wearing that Sunday back in 2007. I never liked April Fool's day and now even like it less. The worst day of my life as I am notified that my 19-year-old daughter was in a horrible car crash and she had been texting. The next 24 hours are burned into my brain especially the part where the doctor notified me that there was no brain activity. I was all alone in that hospital since family and friends had had to leave for work and their own lives. That day I lost a piece of me, my support, my best friend my child. The weeks after have become extremely fuzzy. One instance does still stand out even though I do not know when it happened just was weeks after Amanda's death, her funeral had been held. Life was supposed to be returning back to what some would call normal, even though my normal had forever been altered. I was in the hot tub one evening really crying my eyes out. I never did get angry with God. I did however question God. I was asking him so many why's. Through all my jumbled questions I heard "put it to use". I paused and listened more closely. The voice repeated "put it to use". What was I to put to use and how? The voice went on to say "your daughter's death can be used to save lives". There was nothing special about my Amanda except maybe to me. Nothing special about her death that I at least thought others would care about. A week later my husband was cleaning carpets for a woman who had teen daughters. He was sharing Amanda's story. The woman asked if I would share it with others. Without asking me, my husband replied that I would. Turned out she taught driver's ed. The very next night I shared the details of Amanda's crash. Had to read my carefully written statement. I cried so much throughout it that I thought that the kids would not care. When I finished many were wiping their eyes. Their statements to me at the end I knew then what God was talking about. Telling Amanda's story could save the life of a teen. I will never know but I do know that it is my purpose and mission in life.

Since that very rough beginning I have teamed with organizations to better impact the lives of not just teens but adults as well. It has been over 9 1/2 years now since I said goodbye to the physical Amanda, but I carry her in my heart. She once again is giving me her loving support and God is providing the avenue for me to go and relive the worst day of my life so another mother hopefully will never have to go through the horror of losing a child.

The summer break was busy for the board as we struggled to find a suitable candidate for the Social Studies position. We are grateful for Mrs. Nancy Mintz' willingness to serve in that capacity for us this school year. So far our year has been a blessed one with a great group of kids. They have really "bought in" to what it means to be Lustre students as they are led by faithful staff and administration at LCHS who truly desire God's best for them.

Prayer requests include:

...our current challenge and biggest concern is overall enrollment. We gained just 4 freshmen after graduating 11 seniors and, most concerning, only added one dorm student to begin the year. While there were the usual number of international applicants, many did not follow through for reasons unknown. As you may imagine, this has resulted in a financial shortfall which has required some restructuring of services to make best use of our resources. Also, we continue to seek a full time/permanent Social Studies Teacher. So please remember in prayer LCHS regarding **finances**, the need for **students** in the dorm, an excellent **Social Studies candidate**, as well as the board itself for wisdom to make difficult decisions. God is doing amazing things in the lives of ourstudents and He is able to see us through!
