this question

"Imagine playing basketball with an extra hundred pounds on your back..." Mr. Marasco raised the question to the students looking at him carrying a simple bag with weights amounting to one hundred pounds.

The day was the twelfth of January, 2017, where he talked to the students about spiritual bondage. Spiritual bondage can come from many forms including self-harm. how we talk, entertainment, expectations, and relationships. These are the kinds of sin that can control a person. At this point Mr. Marasco had Michael put the weights into the bag he had put on, to demonstrate what he felt when he didn't confess his sins to God. He bought up Psalms 32:1-5 to tell us how many people deny their sins by lying, shaded truths, or keeping it all in. If they confess their sins to God it will be forgiven. At this moment, he took off his bag and showed the relief of losing all the excessive weight after one confesses his/her sin. He closed with verses from James 5:19-20, Galatians 6:1, James 5:16, and the worship team sang in closing "All I have is Christ."

The Lustre boys basket-ball team travelled to Saco on January 13 to take on the North Country Mavericks, hoping to end their losing streak and start a winning one. The Lions were playing without two eighth graders, and several other players who were under the weather.

After starting with a 6-5 Lustre lead, North Country, behind 21 first half points from Cache Younkin, made a 10 point comeback. The teams battled back and forth until half time, when the scoreboard showed a 26-19 lead for the Mayericks.

The third quarter was another lead stretcher for North Country, but the Lions fought hard to stay in the game and made a great comeback. It wasn't enough, though, because the final scoreboard showed a score of 51-47 in favor of North Country.

Michael Brown led Lustre's scorers with 17 points, followed by Zach Brown with 14, Levi Brown with 11, Thomas Brown with 3, and Kyle Pederson with 2.

The following night was another game, this one having Lustre facing the Dodson Coyotes at home. Despite a sluggish start, the Lions led 12-10 after one quarter. Lustre jumped all over the lead and kept on pushing it. At the end of two, the Lions were ahead 20-10 after not letting Dodson score in the second quarter. The game continued like that and after the third quarter, Lustre had pushed their lead to 32-20. After they found their rhythm in the fourth quarter, the scoreboard showed Lustre winning 50-26.

Levi had a great game, scoring his season high of 19 points. Michael followed with 14, Thomas with 12, and Zach with 5.
