BRUCE INION SPEAKS IN CHAPEL BY: LEVI BROWN

On January 11th, the LCHS students came to chapel for the first time this year. Our guest speaker was Bruce Inion from Circle Evangelical Church in Circle, MT. The worship team sang some songs and then Bruce was introduced and began his message. Bruce started off with some games and passed out some delicious homemade beef jerky for us to chew on during the service.

His main topic was on 3 Biblical life metaphors. He said the way we see our life shapes our life, and used the life metaphor of a box of chocolates: your life is like a box of chocolates, you are never sure of what you will get. His three main metaphors though were: A Test, A Trust, and Our Temporary Assignment.

Bruce Inion said that in this life, you will face trials, temptations, refining and testing. These have occurred more than 200 times in the Bible. Some of his examples were from Abraham, Jacob, Hezekiah, and Jacob. He said that God allows you to be tested to see what your faith life is like, and that through many tribulations, we must enter the kingdom of God, which is found in 1 Corinthians 10:13. The second metaphor used "A Trust;" Bruce pointed out that God has trusted us with this earth and it is our responsibility to take care of it and manage it. Our time on earth, our energy, intelligence, opportunity, relationships, and resourced are all gifts from God, so we need to not take them for granted and need to take care of them and

manage them.

His third metaphor was "A Temporary Assignment." He said that our days are numbered and are very short in the grand scheme of things. And just to back himself up, he pointed out that we are called strangers, pilgrims, visitors, foreigners, and travelers, but not a name with a permanent meaning. But he did point out that we are Christ's Ambassadors and that Heaven is our home. This world and everything in it will pass away—we aren't home yet, but while we are here, we need to represent Christ, and we need to take care of this world because God entrusted it to us.

Bruce Inion finished off with saying that our time here is short and that we need to spend it wisely.

fought game by 1, the final score being 38-39.

Next, it was the Lion's turn to take the court. This game, as well, was close throughout, with Bainville leading at times up by about 6 points. With just a few seconds remaining in the third quarter, and the Lions down by 9, Terry got the defensive rebound, turned, and threw up a 70-footer as the

While the game started out pretty tough, with Lustre being down 8 early on, the girls continued to fight back, tying it 27-27 at the

half. In the 2nd half, the Lions roared out to take the lead, being up 7 points at the end of the 3rd quarter. Each team scored 10 in the final stanza, leaving the Lady Lions with a 59-52 victory.

Having just watched two victories in a row, the Lions confidently took the court. A perfect 3-0 record for the night, however, was not to be. The Lions got down early, and were never able to completely recover. The Bearcubs continued to pound it in down low to their 6'5" senior post Jayson Jackson, and just kept building the score. The Lions ended up on the losing end, with the final score coming in at 65-46.
