Lustre's chapel speaker on December 7th walked into the assembly room and immediately brought a smile to every face. Cris Mwenes, bishop of 86 churches in Kenya, has been visiting the United States for the past two and a half months and plans to return home on the 20th of December. As a friend of Lyle Wall, Mr. Mwenes was overjoyed to be spending his afternoon with the folks of

Lustre and had a challenging topic on his heart.

After opening in prayer, Cris directed us to Ephesians 3:14-19 where Paul is urging the church in Ephesus to be "rooted and established in love". He encouraged us to love one another the way that Christ loves us. "Do your lives reflect Christ?" was the question Cris posed. He pointed out that if Christ has the #1 spot in our lives, we should

not be embarrassed to talk about Him and share His love with others. He backed up this point by going to Romans 1:16 which says, "For I am not ashamed of the gospel because it is the power of God for the salvation to everyone who believes: first for the Jew, then to the Gentile."

After spending just 45 minutes with Cris, it was apparent that his love for Christ filled him to the point
