Basketball season for the Lustre Christian boys' team began with a battle against the Hinsdale Raiders. Hinsdale, having already played four games, was well into its season, forcing the Lions to play catch up on December 18. The game started out with Hinsdale on the offensive and barreling ahead, and the Lions barely keeping up. Problems with defense, boxing out, and lack of smooth playing overall contributed to Lustre Christian's struggles. According to the game's players, the game was a

learning experience, and a good glimpse at what the team would face come tournament time. For much of the first three quarters, Hinsdale controlled the tempo and the flow of the game, with only five points scored by Lustre in the first half. However, during the second half, signs of life were seen. The Lions scored 14 points in the third quarter, and 12 in the fourth. The real silver lining, though, was the defense displayed during the fourth. The coach and players were encouraged by their will-

ingness to dive on loose balls, fight for passes, and read the offense. The game was a defeat, with Hinsdale finishing with 58, and Lustre falling short with 31. However, it provided the Lions with both a starting place and a goal – in ability, mental toughness, and overall vision for the season's future. High scorers were Mawin Kulpruks with 8, Jacques Ndengeyingoma and Silas Xia with 7, Michael Brown with 5, and Mack Young and Teagan Friesen with 2.

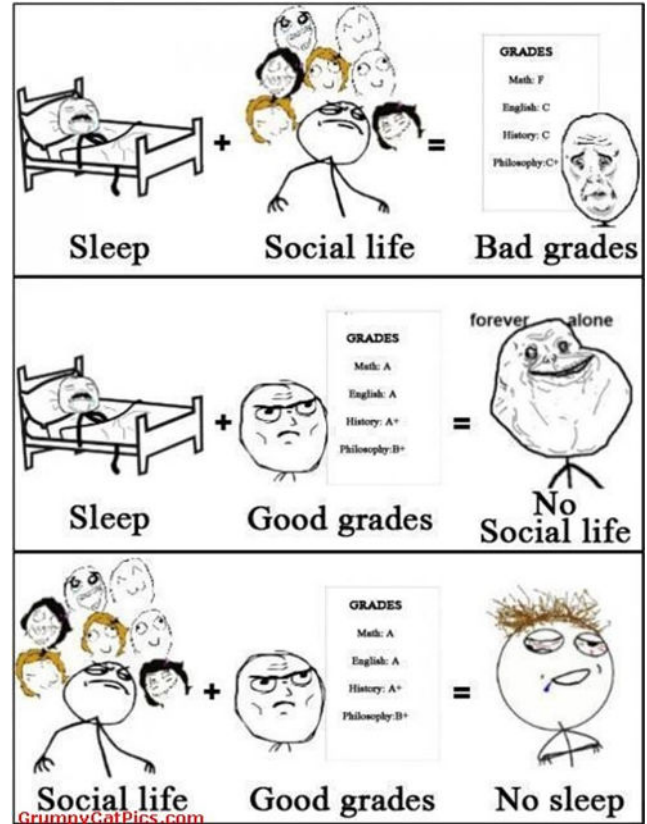
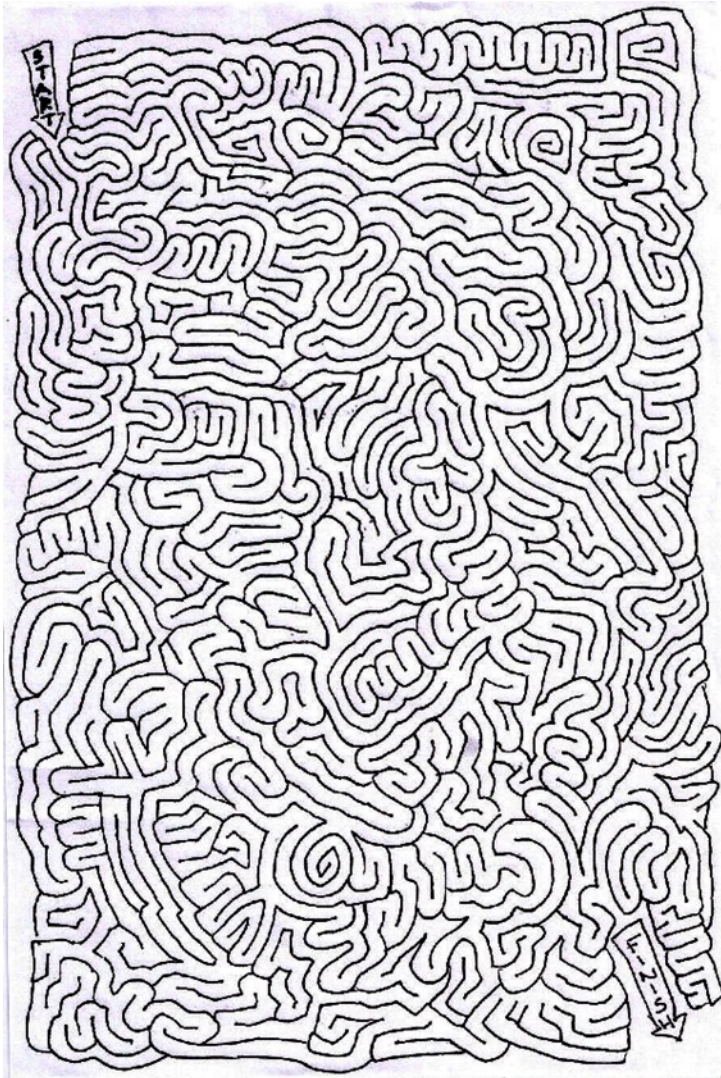
