PASTOR FRANK EXPOUNDS ON HOLY SPIRIT BY: THOMAS BROWN

LCHS welcomed Pastor Frank to speak at our weekly chapel. The topic being presented was the Person and Ministry of the Holy Spirit. He led off with by saying that, "The most important thing about you is what you think about God; therefore, the most important thing you can think about is God." He then talked about how we get to know God. There are 3 ways: First, through general revelation; (which limited) secondly, through special revelation in the written Word of God; and thirdly, through special revelation in the Living Word of God (Jesus). He then went on to talk about how there is one God, who is revealed in three persons. Of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, the hardest to understand, to relate to, would be the Holy Spirit. Most of us have some experience with an earthly father, so he is easier to relate to. As for Jesus, he came to earth in human form, and His interactions are recorded in the Gospels; this makes him the easiest to relate to. The Holy Spirit is mentioned in the beginning of the Bible in Genesis 1:2. However, throughout the rest of the Old Testament, you seldom see the Holy Spirit, as most of the references are to God the Father. Once you get to the New Testament though, there is an explosion in references to the Holy Spirit. There are two major points about the Holy Spirit that were taught. First, He is God. He is called God in Genesis 1:2, and in Acts 5:3-4. He is all knowing, He performs the

work of God, and is equal to both the Father and the Son, as seen in Matthew 28:19 and 2 Corinthians 13:14. The second major point that was made by

Pastor Frank was that the Holy Spirit is a Person. The Holy Spirit has emotions,

(Ephesians 4:30) Intellect, (1 Corinthians 2:11; Isaiah 40:13) Will, (1 Corinthians 12:11; Acts 13:2; Acts 16:6-7) and can be lied to. (Acts 5:3) With such an extensive topic, you could really take a lot of time

to study it. Unfortunately, the time for chapel ran out, resulting in bringing the topic to a close before its final conclusion. The good news for the students, however, was that they received a booklet that further expounded on the subject of the Holy Spirit.

Label/package as followed:


- Peppernuts 4 cups/bag

- ~ Please thaw all frozen baked goods before packaging for Schmeckfest bakesale (excluding verenika!) Thawing should be done outside of the bags to prevent accumulation of moisture on baked goods.

When everyone finally sat down, Lisa directed our focus to a different kind of entanglement: technology. As a demonstration she brought different types of telephones that have been used throughout the past eighty years. The evolution of the phone brought us all the way up to the smart phone that Mrs. Neufeld

held in her hand. She admitted that technology has been an incredible tool, but with great power comes great responsibility. Oftentimes, people think of texting as being a one-on-one conversation, but it is always possible that your texts will be shared. Therefore, you should always ask the question, "Can I trust who I am talking to?" Once a text is sent, you cannot take it back, so it is important to think before you send.

Lisa also talked about the negative effects of

the constant easy access. When screen time increases, people begin to detach from those around them. She recommended a few fixes. including charging your phone in another room before bed, time limits during the day, and having someone keep you accountable. After highlighting several verses in 2 Timothy 1, she closed by reminding us to use our phones with discretion and to ask the Spirit of God to help us make wise decisions in our technologydriven society.
