Pastor Julito Magdanua Speaks in Chapel By: Levi Brown

On Tues., Feb. 12 Pastor Julito Magdanua from First Baptist Church in Poplar came to share with the LCHS students what he had on his mind. The main theme was about that little passageway that the few find. Particularly he spoke on 3 main types of people in this life.

The 1st are those that sit on the throne of their own lives. They run their own lives and God is on the outside and wants nothing to do with Him.

The 2nd, is the person who allows God to be a part of their life and calls himself a "Christian" but still sits on his own throne of life. This person goes to church, opens the Bible periodically...and their favorite motto is "I do it mv wav."

The 3rd person, lives his life on God's terms. God is on the throne and does His will and follows it. This person lives by the word of God. This is the true Christian! You may not think this matters much or you may be thinking that, "I'll just wait to get right with God later in life." But your days are not guaranteed. What if that day comes and you breath your last and you were "caught off guard"... it doesn't fly. Only those who follow God and do the will of the Father will enter the Kingdom of God..

He then spoke on prayer and asking God different things and asked us how much we talk with Him. "Do you ask God's permission to deal with things of the heart or do you ignore and choose yourself and go your own way?" Pastor Lito asked. He then asked what we will do after we go to college. Did you ask God? He then told us that it matters what God says, and that's all that matters, even if you may not like it. God knows the bigger picture and knows far more than we can comprehend. God says it, that settles it. He then asked us another challenging question. "If you're really a Christian, who calls the shots in your life?"

He finished his time with the story about the wise man that built his house upon a rock. Most will remember this as a song as one we sang as a little kid. The wise man built his house upon a rock and the house stood firm. The foolish man built his house upon the sand and when the rain came down, so did the house. What is

the foundation in your life? When the storms of this life come, will your foundation withstand it?

On February 22, Dawson Olfert showed up to chapel - dressed to impress. The '97 LCHS graduate was decked out in his hiking gear and ready to share about a trip he took when he was a high schooler. The summer after Dawson's junior year, he decided to take a three-week hiking trip in the Sierra Mountains that had a great impact on his life.

Mr. Olfert started out by setting down his massive backpack and revealing its contents. Inside, he had packed food, rope, a sleeping bag, a tent, a map, and several other necessities. He then began walking through the highlights of his trip. Oftentimes, the going was rough, and not all of his

memories are fond. What he discovered though, was how those experiences on the hike related to his "hike" with God as a Christian. For example, on the their first day out, Dawson recalled being very out of shape and said many were stumbling with weariness by the end of the day. When Christians first begin their walk with God, the road can be rough and filled with many stumbling points. By the end of the trip, Dawson remembers the whole crew being guite smelly and in desperate need of a shower. He used this to illustrate an important point: God still loves us, even though sometimes we stink.

Mr. Olfert then directed us to sever-

al passages about staying on God's path. Matthew 7:13 says, "Enter through the narrow gate. For wide is the gate and broad is the road that leads to destruction, and many enter through it." He also read Proverbs 2:1-9 to show the importance of staving on God's path by seeking after wisdom and understanding. When we stray from God's plan for our lives, He doesn't just hang out with us on our destructive path. Instead, He guides us back into His path. Dawson learned many valuable lessons while traipsing around the Sierras and chief among is how God meets us in the middle of our everyday circumstances and challenges us to grow in Him.


