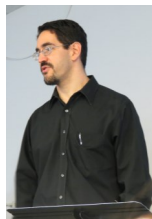

Anyone who likes spicy foods should try peppernuts. One type of German food served at Lustre Christian High School's annual Schmeckfest is peppernuts; it's a traditional Christmas spice cookie. Peppernuts are tiny, hard spice cookies, which are a popular treat in

Germany, Denmark, the Netherlands and Russia. Peppernuts can contain aromatic spices, such as cinnamon, cloves, ginger, pepper, and anise. The tradition is carried on by Mennonites in the United States. Peppernuts are believed to have come to America with immi-

grants sometime in the 19th century. Some recipes do call for small amounts of pepper and ground almonds or walnuts, hence the name peppernuts, or paepa naet in German. Don't forget to try these tasty treats this year at Schmeckfest on March 27, 2015!

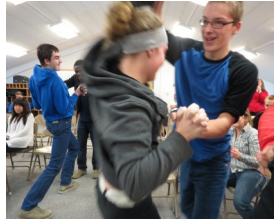

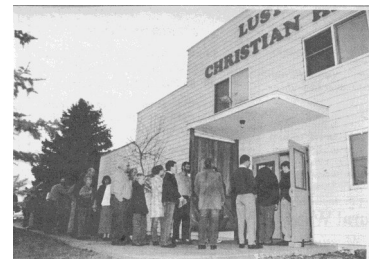

25th annual Schmeckfest was held. Compared to the first Schmeckfest, it was monumental. In preparation for it, 600 pounds of meat, 2500 verenika pockets, 100 cabbage rolls, 36 gallons of soup, 27 gallons of moos, 80 dozen zweibach, 65 dozen new year's cookies, 112 dozen perischke (for those of who, like me, struggle with math, that's 1344 pockets), 22 gallons of pepper nuts, and 15 gallons of gravy were prepared. It was



emceed by the hilarious Dean Reddig and Al Martin, and was by all means memorable. Schmeckfest has come a long way since its beginnings, and has changed its name (it was known only as "Smorgasbord" until 1973). What started as a bake sale has become a Montana-wide sensation, with people from Billings to Missoula attending,

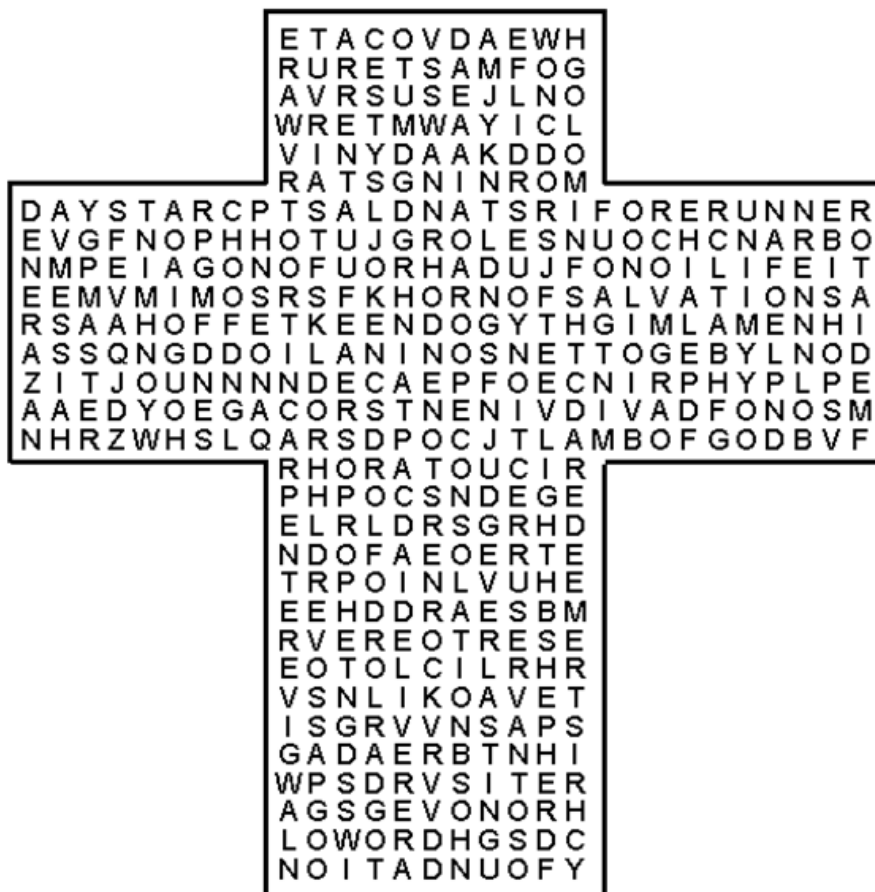
among people from other states. What had only 450 attendees now has nearly 1,000 yearly. In 1992, Henry Beier bought a leather painting for \$650 - one painting sold for what the first Schmeckfest made in total. In fifty years, it has only been postponed twice (well, thrice, but twice in 2011 and once in 2013). What will this year's Schmeckfest, and the next 50 years bring? All we can say for sure is great things!

"OK," the man says. "Why did you make women so pretty?"

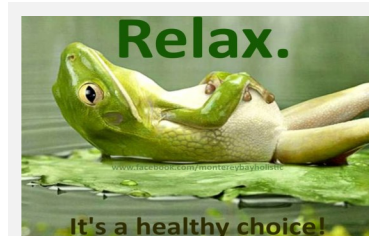
GOD says, "So you would like them."

Schmeckfest Bake Sale Reminders

All pre-orders need to be in by March 23.

Please bring at least three items for the bake sale. Everything sells so if you can bring more items it would be appreciated.

Please package items as follows:

Peppernuts – 4 cups/ package

Sweet rolls and maple sticks – 12/package

Perishke, buns, zwieback – 12/ package

Frozen verenika – 6 or 12/ package

Some items that are always requested are verenika, zwieback, peppernuts, cherry perishke, pecan pie, and raspberry jam. Other good items are fancy breads, freezer jams, jellies, syrup, home-made mustard, and pies. Please do not bring cream pies, which includes pumpkin.

We never have too many frozen verenika. With the preorders, many are already spoken for before the night of Schmeckfest. We can always use more.

Plastic bags for items are available at the MB and EMB churches.

Be sure to label the type of item in each package as well as the quantity.

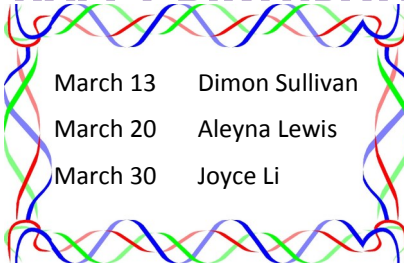
