For everyone around the world, September 11, 2001 will forever be remembered as a day of tragedy, sacrifice, loss, and heroism. On this notorious day, terrorists working for the organization Al-Qaeda hijacked four Boeing airliners, two 767s and two 757s. The two 767s crashed into the Twin Towers, and one 757 crashed into the Pentagon. The second 757,

Flight 93, was delayed for 42 minutes, so those onboard learned of the attacks in New York and D.C. When the terrorists tried to hijack the plane, heroic passengers onboard gave their lives to save countless others at the intended target area. They called their families, and then attacked the cockpit. The plane crashed into a Pennsylvania cornfield. That day,

2996 people died as a result of the attacks. This included 343 firefighters and paramedics, 23 New York City police officers, and 37 Port Authority police officers. The Attacks led to what defined George Bush's presidency - the war on terrorism- and the manhunt and eventual assassination of Osama Bin Laden on May 2, 2011.


First Chapel of the Year

Her favorite school subject is currently art.


When asked her first impression of Lustre, she said she thought it was small, but everyone is very nice and friendly.


