## Introductory Chapel: Pastor Frank By Kassie Kirkaldie

Pastor Frank Lenihan was our first chapel speaker for the year, on Sept. 20, after two chapels of watching a movie, "The Atheist Delusion." After our worship team led us with two songs of worship, Lenihan introduced himself and gave some background info about him and his family. He then went on to tell us about Lustre... making a point that we are all favored, both in the community's eyes and in God's eyes. Our community is full of loving and caring people, he said,

and they are all invested in the school and its students because they care about our spiritual growth.

Since this was technically an introduction chapel, Pastor Frank then focused on informing us on what chapel is all about. He talked about who chapel is for, what chapel is about, when and where we have it, why we have

and family/friends who visit. Anyone can listen, and anyone can share if they'd like. He went on to talk

It's a chance to hear from different speakers who present different perspectives, concerning spiritual issues, as well, and to be presented to Christianity if one was completely new to it. God. Lots of other pointers were given as well, such as to avoid chatting with our neighbors, giving the speaker our

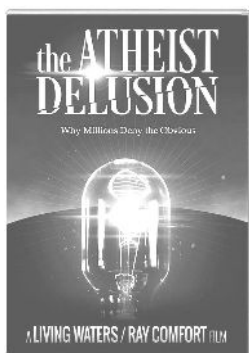

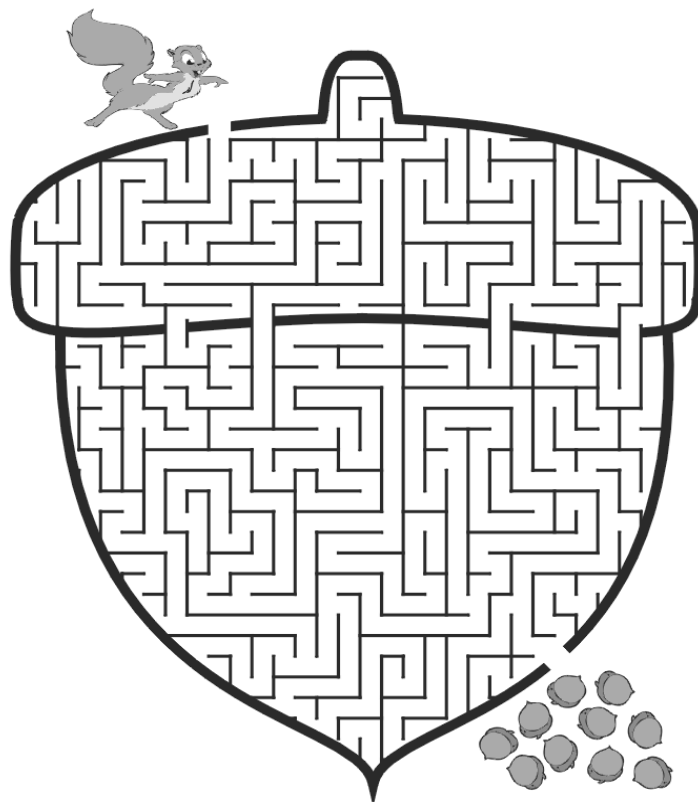
