

The country of Haiti has been in the news recently due to the events leading to nationwide demonstrations. Commercial flights are operating in and out of the coun-

try, but there has been a Level 4 Travel Advisory issued to the country to Haiti. A Level 4 Travel Advisory means, do not travel to this country. This is the highest advisory level due to a greater likelihood of threatening risks.

Please continue to pray for the country of Haiti and for their government as well as the countries of Venezuela and others countries struggling with unrest.




