May Day by Ernest Uy

May Day, celebrated on May 1st, is characterized by maypoles, flowers, and festivities that

celebrate the coming of spring. However, other things are remembered, with a somewhat darker history. Some Socialists, Communists, and Anarchists have celebrated May 1st as International Labor Day after the

infamous Haymarket Affair in Chicago, IL. On May 1st, 300,000 to 500,000 workers, some led by anarchists, went on strike all across the nation to fight for an 8-

hour workday. On May 3rd, a strike at the McCormick Reaper Works in Chicago resulted in sev-

eral strikers being injured or killed when they fought with police. The next day cemented the week in infamy. After several socialists and anarchists spoke in Haymarket Square, the crowd steadily

broke up as weather conditions worsened. A police force was sent in to break up the remaining stragglers. A bomb was detonated in the midst of the police

force, killing an officer. The resulting chaos killed and injured several people. Seven anarchists were sentenced to death by hanging, though several weren't even present at the time the bomb went off. An 8th anarchist served 15 years in prison. Four people were executed, one committed suicide in prison, and the other 3 ended up being pardoned. In July 1958, President Dwight Eisenhower signed a resolution naming May 1st "Loyalty Day," to disassociate from the Workers Of the World on May Day.



On April 17, 1952 Conrad Hilton and Kansas Senator Frank Carlson initiated a bill which declared that the President would set aside a National Day of Prayer. This bill passed. In 1983, at the Constitution Hall in Washington D.C., National Day of Prayer was first observed. In attendance at this initial observance was Vice President George Bush and Dr. Lloyd Ogilvie. Finally, in 1986, the National Prayer Committee wrote a bill designating a specific day for America's "National Day of Prayer." Once the National Prayer Committee's bill was ratified, in 1988, there was officially a day set aside for prayer. National Day of

Prayer is the first Thursday in May.

This year, National Day of Prayer fell on Thursday, May 2nd. It is customary for the high school to gather together, staff and students, and participate in a time of prayer. Last year the Student Council hosted a breakfast during first period before splitting the student body into prayer groups. Student Council took charge of this event again this year, planning a before school prayer time with a breakfast directly following. The student split up into two prayer groups and the adults formed a third, each group found a quite spot and prayed for 20 minutes.

After the prayer time, everyone gathered in the cafeteria for a breakfast provided by Student Council. Overall, the observance of National Day of Prayer was well attended at LCHS and was encouraging to the whole school.

On Tuesday, April 23 the Lustre Track team traveled to Malta for the Malta Invitational track meet. It turned out to be a really nice day for events. The top people who placed were Wisly with 2nd place in the 100 meter dash and 3rd place in 300m hurdles, Tiara Whitmus with 4th place in shotput and 4th place in javelin, and Sadie 4th place in triple jump. The boys relay team which consisted of Diego, Ernest, Braeden, and Wisly

placed 4th place in the 4 x 100 relay. They boys also placed 3rd in the 4 x 400 relay. Terry, Ernest, Joshua, and Braden ran that relay. The girls also had a 4 x 100 relay team. The team consisted of Emily, Ashley, Kassie, and Sadie. Their team got 5th place. There were many PRs for the day. Wisly had a PR in the 100m dash with a time of 12.56.

lin with a throw of 82-07. Diego and Wisly had PRs in high jump with jumps of 5-04 and 5-02 respectively. Ernest and Joshua both got PRs in long jump with jumps of 15-08.75 and 12-06.50. Wisly, Ernest, and Joshua all got PRs in triple jump also with jumps of 35-05.75, 32-07.25, and 28-08.75. On the girls side Sadie got a PR in the 200m with a time of 33.45. Tiara had a PR in both javelin and shotput with throws of 31-09.50 and 92-09.

On Friday, April 26, the track team headed to Lambert for the Lambert Invitational. There were several athletes who placed in the top six. Braeden placed 5th in the 400m run. Wisly placed 3rd in both 300m and 110m hurdles. The boys 4 x 100 relay team got 4th. Terry and Diego tied for 5th place in high jump. Wisly got 3rd in triple jump and Diego placed 4th in triple jump. On the girls side the girls relay team placed 5th in the 4 x 100. Tiara placed 5th in shotput and 2nd in discus. Emily Eggar placed 4th in high jump. Sadie placed 2nd in triple jump and Kassie placed 6th in triple jump.

On Saturday, May 4th, the track athletes went to their last regular season track meet before districts. Many athletes placed in this meet. Braeden



In the girls events Sadie placed 3rd and Ashley 4th in the 100m. Ashley placed 3rd and Sadie placed 6th in the 200m. The girls 4 x 100 relay placed 3rd. Tiara placed 4th in shotput and 5th in discus. Sadie placed 2nd in long and triple jump and Kassie placed 3rd in long jump and 4th in triple jump.




