
but it became a national event which also was carried out in other countries all over the world (Canada, Democratic Rep. of Congo, Kenya, Japan, South Korea etc.).

The National Honor Society was established in 1921 by the National Association of Secondary School Principals (NASSP). NHS was the first nationwide honor society. It was also introduced to recognize and encourage scholastically outstanding high school students. National Honor Society is based on four pillars: Scholarship, Ser-



vice, Leadership, and Character. Each school has its own requirements, but is based around these four.

- Scholarship: In our school the required GPA is a 3.4 or higher.
- Service: In some schools there is a required amount of service hours. LCHS does not require hours, but they do look at what students are involved in. NHS

looks at volunteer work or uncompensated work as a service. Some examples of service around Lustre that fit the bill are: helping at cleaning up days, AWANA. Students should choose a service project that is meaningful to them, not just so you check the box and call it done.

- Leadership: NHS looks at positions where you have been a leader.

During the week of September 8th and September 14th, the Lustre Lady Lions had a very busy week. On Tuesday, the 10th the Lustre Lady Lions took on the Wolf Point Lady Wolves JV team. They finished that game with a win in three matches. The really busy day was the Scobey Invite Tournament on the 14th. During that tournament they played 2 matches against Circle, Bainville, Ekalaka, Savage, Wibaux, and Scobey.

The Lady Lions lost to Circle 25-17 and again 26-24. They finished with a total of 13 kills and 29 digs. They won once against Bainville, 25-17 but lost in the next match 26-24. They finished with 12 total team kills and a whopping 39 digs! Against Ekalaka, they lost 25-11 both matches. They finished with 7 kills and 4 aces. Tiara with half of the 4. Against Savage they lost 25-9 and 25-21. They finished with 12 kills, 8 aces, 27 digs and 9 assists, 6 of those assists were from Lily. Against Wibaux the Lady Lions



lost 25-11 and 25-17. In this game, Amber made a great showing defensively with all of the Lady Lion's 2 blocks. Olivia was also doing her part on the defensive end with half of the teams 14 digs. Finally, against Scobey the Lions lost 25-15 and 25-22. In this game, Lily had 7 of the Lady Lion's 9 assists and Tiara had

4 of the 10 kills. The Lady Lions are grateful for the experience and will be sure to use the knowledge they learned during this busy week to help them when tournament time comes.

as 8 digs, and Lily had 6 assists. The Lady Lions fought hard and kept their heads up even though they lost.

Chapel on Thurs., Sept. 5 was really interesting. We had Pastor Frank come in and talk to us about Israel.

He started off by asking us what we were passionate about and then told us what he used to be passionate about. As a high schooler he had a passion for football and FFA (Future Farmers of America). When he got out of high school, he discovered more passions, one being motorcycle riding and the other being public speaking.

In 2001 it all changed for him. He went to Israel and he found a different pas-

On Monday, September 9th, Denis Weins came to speak to the high school about SAT 7. Mr. Wiens is from Kansas City, but he grew up in South Africa. He fluently speaks English, French, and other native languages in the Middle East. He served in Mali for 20 years, and he's been working with SAT 7 for 16 years now. He started off chapel by telling us all about SAT 7 and what it's about.

SAT 7 is a television broadcast that provides free entertainment and education services to people located in the Middle East. The only requirement to get these channels is a satellite dish. The channels included in SAT 7 are ARABIC, KIDS, PARS, and TURK. They reach out to all ages, and teach them about God and entertain them while doing so.

After explaining what SAT 7 was, Mr. Wiens then showed us

one of the videos played on the channels about a refugee girl. The young girl's name was Myriam and she was being interviewed. Her original home was located in Iraq until her city was wiped out by the terrorist group, ISIS. Myriam never lost her faith in Jesus, but instead she found strength in these terrifying times. She presented 3 wishes in this interview after she declared that she had forgiven ISIS.

Her first wish was to see her friend Sandra

again who had lived in the city with her before the attack. Her second wish was to go home and go back to school. Myriam's third wish was that the world would see her story. He opened it up with a prayer and two stories. The first story was about a lady getting beat up by a group of guys, and the other story was about a girl who tried drugs. He spoke of a passage talking about God

creating a clean heart for David. We opened up to Psalm 51:10, and we read about David's life falling apart. In 2nd Samuel 5:13 it talks about David and his wives (at least 18 of them). Kings were not supposed to be proud, but David wasn't obeying these things. 2nd Samuel 11 is the infamous story of David and Bathsheba, and David lusting after her. David clearly loved God, but he was putting women, wealth, and power in place of God. God's trying to give him a right heart, but he was letting evil direct him. To go back to the story of David and Bathsheba again... she

became pregnant, and David tried to cover it up. Pastor John explained how lust can lead to adultery, and then to murder. This statement played into the stories at the beginning of the chapel he talked about, and how people get into crimes. David had displeased the Lord, and Nathan pointed it out to him. David ends up repenting, and God tells him he's forgiven. When David realized all the wrong he had done, his heart broke. Psalm 51 was a public confession of David's for all of Israel to hear and know. David ended up taking blame, and he was honest with God. He hum-

bled himself, after God humbled him. Pastor John explained how when you sin, it's ultimately against God. Even though these crimes were against people, all of the sin was ultimately against God. To sum this all up, David realized he was wicked in the end, and he wanted a clean heart and to be purified. This ties into the song we sang at the beginning of the chapel.

God can change you and cleanse your heart. Don't be afraid to come to God and ask Him for forgiveness. He can wash away your sins, and create a clean heart in you.

Every year we get reminded of one of the worst moments that happened in American history. The attacks of 9/11. In memory of the many innocent people, and brave fire-fighters that lost their lives during those horrible moments when the two planes hit the twin towers to the

point when they collapsed. This day of remembrance was proclaimed by President George W. Bush during the immediate aftermath of the attacks, as a **National Day of Prayer and Remembrance for the Victims of the Terrorist Attacks on September 11, 2001**. In memory of the

people who died, a bill was introduced that year to the U.S. House on October 25 to make this day a day of mourning. Everybody voted it in with the votes coming in at 407-0 with only 25 members not voting. In the capital the flags fly at half-mast on Columbus Circle to honor the dead in the

attack. Additionally, moment of silence is observed to correspond with the attacks, beginning at 8:46 a.m. It is not considered a federal holiday so businesses and schools stay open in observance of the occasion. Memorials are still held though for the victims.


