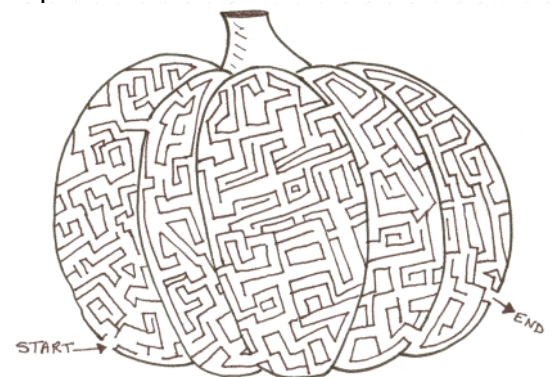
The Students Tell All ... By: Amber Reddig

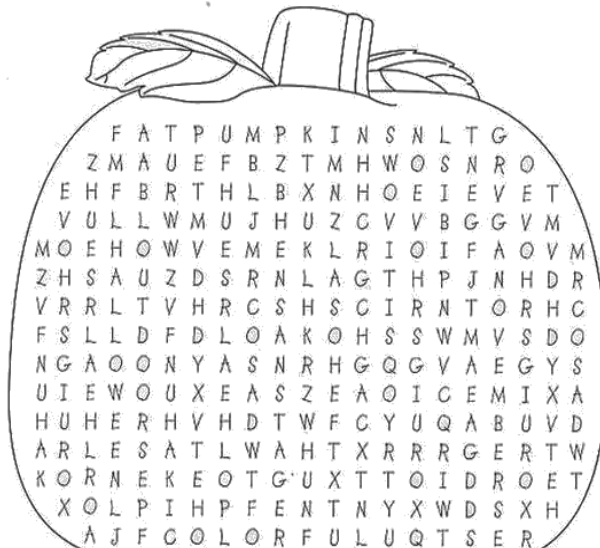
