The World's Best Cookies (Recipe from Anita Cronk - Dorm Mom)

Ingredients:

1 c. butter

1 c. white sugar

1 c. brown sugar, firmly packed

1 t. vanilla extract

1 egg

1 c. salad oil

1 c rolled oats, regular

1 c. crushed cornflakes cereal

1/2 c. shredded coconut

1/2 c. chopped wal-

nuts or pecans 3 1/2 c. all-purpose

flour, sifted

1 t. baking soda

1 t. salt

Directions:

Preheat oven to 325° F.

Cream together the butter, sugars and vanilla extract until light and fluffy. Add egg, mixing well, then salad oil, mixing well. Add oats, cornflakes, coconut and

nuts, stirring well. Then add flour baking soda and salt. Mix well.

Form into balls the size of small walnuts. Place on ungreased cookie sheet. Flatten with fork dipped in water.

Bake for 12 minutes.

Allow to cool on cookie sheet for a few minutes before removing.

Makes 8 dozen cookies
