On September 10, 2020, LCHS had Josh Emmel come speak for their weekly chapel service. To help you get to know Josh Emmel, here some information regarding him. Mr. Emmel is an old friend of Mr. Burkhardt from Minnesota. He lived there for about 2 years and then decided to locomote to Unalakleet, Alaska where he met Mr. Burkhardt. Josh Emmel attended Oak Hills Christian College with the plan of being a missionary but eventually had a change of heart. He felt that God was calling him to becoming a pastor.

This isn't Josh Emmel's first rodeo here, last time

he spoke at chapel he discussed the Image of God, this time he focused on how we Christians can strive to be Christ like and bear His Image. He started off by introducing the verse Genesis 1:26 -27, "Then God said, "Let us make mankind in our image, in our likeness, so that they may rule over the fish in the sea and the birds in the sky, over the livestock and all the wild animals, and over all the creatures that move along the ground." So, God created mankind in his own image, in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them." He then discussed that we can learn how

to be Christ like by knowing God's word. How are some other ways you can be Christ like? Matthew 22 and Deuteronomy 6:4-9 gives us 10 ways we can!

The focus then shifted to, "Christians Under the Law." If you go to the MB Church this should be familiar with you, since Pastor Frank recently touched on this subject. Josh Emmel talked to the students and other people present about how God is our "guardian," protector, and tutor. (Galatians 3: 23-26) To sum everything up, Mr. Emmel made some brief points:

1. We cannot do everything right on our own, but with the

laws and guidelines from God, He helps us mature.

2. Strict laws help us understand the principals to maturity. Lastly, we do not earn righteousness from the law; righteousness comes from the blood of Jesus. We simply need to apply the truths to our lives. Josh Emmel did an amazing job speaking and it left a ton of us thinking about if people can tell we are Christians by our "outside," and how are we bearing God's image.

We are so thankful that Josh Emmel spoke to us. The LCHS students and faculty hope to see him again soon.
