The LCHS girls' volleyball team proceeds to improve in their effort to give teams a run for their money. The season started rough for the girls, but they've come together and are showing more and more improvement with every game they play. On the 11th of September, the Lions faced off against the Savage Warriors in Savage. In game one, the Savage Warriors overcame the Lions with a score of 25-12 and again in game two with a score of 25-13. Then in game two the Lions fought back in game three but lost again with a final score of 25-20. Aubri Holzrichter, Tiara Whitmus, and Ashley O'Hara led the team in stats. Whitmus with 7 kills, 2 aces, and tied with O'Hara with 6 digs each. Holzrichter finished the matches with 1 block and 8 assists. The team finished the matches with

a total of 10 kills, 1 block, 4 aces, 25 digs, and 8 assists. The girls would then go on to play the Wolf Point Wolves JV on September 12th; Tiara Whitmus, Alexa Reddig, and Aubri Holzrichter would lead in stats. Whitmus with 5 kills, 2 aces, and 3 digs. Reddig led with 4 blocks and Holzrichter led with 3 assists. The team finished with a total of 6 kills, 5 blocks, 3 aces, 11 digs, 3 assists. Unfortunately, the Wolves out played the Lions in three games, 25-15, 25-10, and 25-20. On the 15th the girls played the Glasgow JV Scottie's JV. The Scotties took the win in 3 games, but the Lions put up a fight, they finished with a final score of 25-19 for game one, 25-10 in game two, and 25-19 in game three. Leaders in stats were O'Hara, Whitmus, Holzrichter,

Reddig, and Grace Brown. Brown and Reddig both shared two blocks, O'Hara lead the team with 4 kills and 4 aces; Whitmus led the team with 10 digs and Holzrichter led with 5 assists. The team would finish with a total of 5 kills, 6 blocks, 9 aces, 26 digs, and 5 assists. The next two games were rough for the Lady Lions, facing off against the Fairview Warriors on the 17th and then the Richey/Lambert Fusion on the 19th. The Lions lost in three against the Fairview Warriors: 25-18, 25-10, and 25-8. Whitmus led with 2 kills and 13 digs, O'Hara led with 2 aces, Holzrichter led with 1 assist, and Reddig and Brown led with 2 blocks. The team finished with a total of 4 kills, 6 blocks, 3 aces, 35 digs, and 1 assist. Against the Fusion on the 19th, the Lions fell again in 3 match-

es finishing 25-10 in game one, 25-3 in game two, and 25-15 in game three. Whitmus led with 5 kills, 14 digs, and tied with Holzrichter with 2 aces; O'Hara and brown both finished with 1 block, and Holzrichter finished with 4 assists. The team finished with a total of 5 kills, 2 blocks, 6 aces, 26 digs, and 5 assists. The Lady Lions may be struggling right now but the way they've improved in the last weeks, you can bet they are going to put on a show at tournaments this year. Tiara Whitmus says, "We are a young team but we keep gaining more experience. It's the little things that lead to the big things. We've all experienced small victories that will lead to a big victory."


