What Path Are YOU Taking?

On October 22, Mr. Marasco had opened up chapel with a few songs and then Mr. Burkhart split all the students into 5 teams and mixed in the groups were Mr. Butler, Mr. Graybill, Pastor Frank Lenihan and Mr. Marasco. Mr. Leland was the score keeper. In this chapel we got to test our knowledge of the Bible with a game. Mr. Burkhart asked us a question and we would have to write down multiple answers on a clipboard with our team. The winners got bragging rights. This was a fun and great chapel to test all of our knowledge on Christ. Sometimes it surprises you what thought you did not know.

On November 3, we had the pleasure of meeting Josh Krumenacher and one of his sons Josiah from Wisconsin. Josh has a wife and three sons Josiah, Samuel, and Neil. He started off with how he did not know at 16 how much drugs and alcohol would affect him throughout his life. Josh talked about how bad trees bear bad fruit and a good tree bears good fruit.

His wife wrote him a poem, At the Crossroads which, he stated it is practically his testimony.

From 16-25 he repeated how he should be dead by now.

During this time, he got jumped in 2003 by 3 guys resulting in broken ribs and stitching under his eye. In 2003, his Senior year, he fell into a fire pit getting 2nd and 3rd degree burns on his arm, also got a large gash mixing beer and drugs. In June 2006, he tried committing suicide by using a pipe bomb he created in high school, but resulted in an explosion that took his middle and index finger. He had 6 months clean of no drinking, but as he did not drink, he used more pain killers and relapse on Christmas of 2008. This resulted in a DUI fractured ribs, minor cuts, and jail

time. It was not until this day when he was 24 that he had not known the true meaning of Christmas. He made a promise to his family he was going to be clean again, but his friend offered him drugs and he took them after been going to church for a while. He got arrested and woke up in a hospital bed cuffed down and the Cop came in and said "you should be dead now," but the cop said God kept you here and went over scriptures. From this there were two ways to go, either to end his life for good this time or to Gods way. He chose to go Gods way and went to his pastor and told him in detail his life, the

pastor started weeping.

At this time, he accepted Christ and this was when his Dad's friend John mentioned the Hebragon Program. This is where after 2009 he came and was saved. He ended up getting an offer to get an internship and certification of drugs and alcohol counselor. From then on, he was baptized and became study organizer at the Life Point Church learning, and made many friends that became brothers.

In May 2012, he married his wife, in 2013 Josiah was born, in 2015 Samuel was born, and in 2018 Neil was born. He worked for Men for Missions and some of places he went to were; Medellin Colombia in October 2017 and Camaguey Cuba June 2019. He also helped with HOPE a disaster recovers hurricane relief in Texas, Michigan, Illinois, and Louisiana.

Josh challenged everyone to think about the path in life they are taking and if they are taking the path with or without Christ? Josh concluded saying you are not guaranteed to make it through, do not take it for granted like he had.
