Lustre winning the 2nd quarter. The final score of the game was 56-42, posting a win for Dodson.





- ~ Due to changes this year, we will be having 3 shifts for eating/working. Please bring your bake sale items at the beginning of your shift, and drop them off across from the coat room at the WEST entrance to the high school. We will be dividing up frozen verenika, gravy, and cabbage rolls equally between each shift, but all other bake sale items will be "first come first serve" during your shift.
- ~ Schmeckfest is approaching in our near future, and this is your friendly reminder that we ask you to bring at least 3 items for the bake sale, but more is ALWAYS appreciated! Zwiebach will not be served in the food line this year, so extra for bake sale would be a hot ticket item. Other heavily requested items are verenika (there is NEVER enough), dark and light peppernuts, perishke, pie (especially pecan) and raspberry jam. Of course other home made goods are welcome too!
