The girls faced up against the Froid Lake Lady Red Hawks for their first game of the tournament. The girls started out slow, but soon made their first bucket, from Alexa Reddig and 17-footer from Ashley O'Hara. The Lady Lions put in a valiant effort, but ulti-

mately fell to Froid 58 – 25. High scorers in the game were Alexa Reddig with 9, Aubri Holzrichter with 7, Tiara Whitmus with 5, and O'Hara and Grace Brown with 2. Whitmus had 9 rebounds.

Moving down the bracket, the Lady Lions found themselves up against the Circle Wildcats in the loser out game. Starting out strong, Reddig carried the lions to a small lead over the Wildcats for a majority of the first quar-





### Schmeckfest Bake Sale 2021

\*\*\* Please Note: there will be NO PRE-ORDERS this year\*\*

- ~ Due to changes this year, we will be having 3 shifts for eating/working. Please bring your bake sale items at the beginning of your shift, and drop them off across from the coat room at the WEST entrance to the high school. We will be dividing up frozen verenika, gravy, and cabbage rolls equally between each shift, but all other bake sale items will be "first come first serve" during your shift.
- ~ Schmeckfest is approaching in our near future, and this is your friendly reminder that we ask you to bring at least 3 items for the bake sale, but more is ALWAYS appreciated! Zwiebach will not be served in the food line this year, so extra for bake sale would be a hot ticket item. Other heavily requested items are verenika (there is NEVER enough), dark and light peppernuts, perishke, pie (especially pecan) and raspberry jam. Of course other home made goods are welcome too!
- ~ Plastic bags and rectangular foam trays for items are available at the MB and EMB churches. Please be sure to label each item as well as the quantity. Labeling is important for selling, people will hesitate to buy if they are unsure of flavor. Label/package as followed:

Peppernuts – 4 cups/bag

Sweet rolls & Maple sticks - 12/package

Perishke, buns, zwieback - 12/ package

Frozen Verenika - 6 or 12 on foam tray/ package

- ~ Please refer to your Schmeckfest "Blue Book" for recipes and further instructions.
- ~ Please thaw all frozen baked goods before packaging for Schmeckfest bake sale (excluding verenika!)Thawing should be done outside of the bags to prevent accumulation of moisture on baked goods.

We appreciate your understanding of circumstance changes, and also the hard work of baking and labeling!

# If you never read this page because it's always the same year after year, it's your Lucky day – there is a lot different this year!

Everyone needs to reserve their ticket online at lustrechristian.org or call (406)392-7949.

If you have a **sponsored ticket** you still need to register online. Choose \*cash on delivery (use this is you have a sponsored ticket) option, then bring that same ticket with you to Schmeckfest.

Please print your ticket, it can be scanned at the Finance table

Entry – Please come to the **south** door, the line will go to the right.

Masks are required and Temperatures will be taken at the door

Food

Please bring all food to the WEST door (new entry)

Please bring your food when you come to LCHS unless you have been given previous instructions. An LCHS student will meet you to carry in food.

Empty containers will be in the locker rooms last name A-O Girls P-Z Boys

Due to the chance of food-borne illnesses, the county sanitarian recommends that whenever possible, prepare food in church or school kitchens. **Wash your hands** frequently with soap and hot water while preparing food.

Please see your Schmeckfest recipe book for instructions on cooking verenika.

Sauerkraut should be in a roaster. Do NOT use aluminum foil. Three #10 cans are needed per recipe.

Foam trays and plastic bags are available at the churches or by request. Use the trays particularly for the more fragile **perishke** and **frozen verenika**. If you bake more than one day in advance, please freeze immediately and thaw baked goods before re-packaging in plastic.

Package by the dozen: **perishke** (please avoid date and/or raisin) **and New Year's cookies** (no sugar on these). **Peppernuts** are to be packaged in <u>four-cup</u> amounts.

### Food Tips:

Please wrap hot foods in newspapers, then wrapped in blankets or towels, etc

Label on the outside what food it is and the amount.

Please **label all** your containers (roasters (es<u>pecial</u>ly lids & liners too), blankets, towels, etc.) in order to find your items after Schmeckfest.

**Moos** needs to be packed in a cooler with ice. A one-gallon drink pitcher works well.

### Thursday Set-up:

Due to the amount of cleaning required by county guidelines, we ask that only those required for practice or set-up be present on Thursday. If you have auction or display items, please contact those committees or a steering committee member to arrange drop off.

### Saturday Clean-up:

Clean-up will begin at **9:00 A.M. Saturday, March 27**. There will be refreshments served after clean up. You are welcome to help Friday night after Schmeckfest, also.

Thank you in advance for all your hard work Friday and Saturday. It takes everyone working together to make a successful Schmeckfest and we appreciate your willingness to support the school!
