Lustre Christian High School welcomed Trisha Reddig on March 25, 2021 to give a Chapel and she spoke on suicide and depression. Trisha started out mentioning that when Covid hit hard last March until now many people in different situations struggle with interactions with other people. Due to not being able to go visit family or people in general many struggled with depression and the thought about suicide. Mrs. Reddig stated 5 signs of depression that includ-

ed; feeling fatigued, persistent sadness, hopelessness, not being loved or worthlessness, and loss of interest in usual activities.

Trisha was talking on how we all have a different story and this is some of her story. Mrs. Reddig was raised in a Catholic church and was saved between ages 12-14. She had a high involvement of daily drugs and drinking. She states "that I was spiraling downhill to a not good future." During this time,

she was very depressed cutting her wrists and taking pills. After all this she came to Lustre and was causing trouble with her parents, teachers, and dorm parents. One day she was sitting in her dorm room isolated and alone with no one around. She previously had been planning to take her life and at that moment it came time where she thought she could not take it anymore. Trisha said that "I could not bring myself to do it, in other words I

'chickened out.'" As time went on, she thought about how if you kill yourself, it is a definite ending there is no coming back from it. In the end if you take your life suicide doesn't end the pain it transfers to someone else. She thought of the verse John 10:8-10 where Satan can kill us. The after high was depression that drove her to cut herself after breakups or fights with her parents. Satan will try to engrain

tial it can reach in the coming meets. As for now the team will continue to learn and improve with a lot of new participants, the track team will be representing


