On September 27, Dawson Olfert spoke in chapel at Lustre Christian High School. His topic was how God opens doors and how we can obey Him. Dawson used the example of El Roi Haiti to illustrate this idea.



El Roi, a school in Port-au-Prince, Haiti, was founded by LCHS alumnus Sandro Dorsainvil. Sandro and his two siblings were born and raised in Haiti by their mother. They often struggled financially and had to move from school to school because of it.

In 2010, a massive 7.0 Mw earthquake hit Haiti. This devastated the country and caused many to go in search of work. Sandro was one of these people. Because he was able to speak English and five other languages, it was easy to find work communicating with others, especially Americans.

It was during his work as a translator that he met Jason and Stephanie Brown. After meeting Sandro and seeing his ambition and talent, they presented him with the opportunity to attend school in the U.S. at LCHS. Sandro came to Lustre in 2013 and, after graduating high school, went on to attend Liberty University. During his time at Liberty University, Sandro began the process of creating El Roi Haiti. His dream was to give kids in his community the opportu-

nities that he did not have and make sure they didn't have to worry about paying for school.

So far, this dream has been an overwhelming success. El Roi Haiti, according to their website, currently provides education for students in kindergarten through eleventh grade with an enrollment of around 305 students.

Dawson's message through this example is how much good can be accomplished if we say
