December 7, 1941: Imagine waking up to gunshots and planes roaring above. This was a reality for the people at Pearl Harbor. We all remember Pearl harbor as a sad day for America when the

After reading our school verse for the year, Ephesians 6:11, Mrs. Brown felt called to talk more about the subjects of spiritual warfare and of God's Truth. Mrs. Brown stated she wasn't seeking to give glory or attention to the enemy in her chapel, and while it isn't one of her favorite topics to speak on, she sees it as necessary in our day and age.

Mrs. Brown started by explaining some things

about our common enemy, Satan. She said that Satan is often portrayed by the world in a joking, nonsensical fashion, when he is far from that in reality. Using Scripture from John 8:44 and II Co-

rinthians 11:14, Mrs. Brown showed us that Satan is described as the "father of lies" and "an angel of light" in the New Testament. She also shared a quote from Charles

But how does one get into the National Honor Society? Well, the criteria for eligibility are based on the four pillars of NHS.



Those pillars are **Scholarship**, **Service**, **Leadership**, and **Character**. For Scholarship, students must have a minimum 3.4 GPA. For Service,

students are judged based on their voluntary contributions to their school or community, without compensation. Students must be resourceful, good problem solvers, and idea contributors for the pillar of Leadership. Leadership experiences can be drawn from school or community activities while working with or for others. Finally, for Character, students must be cooperative, demonstrate

high standards of honesty and reliability, show courtesy and concern for others, as well as respect. Generally, a student with good character maintains a clean disciplinary record according to the NHS standards.

If a student meets all of these four pillars, they are eligible to be inducted into the NHS. If chosen, students will be inducted during a ceremony.
