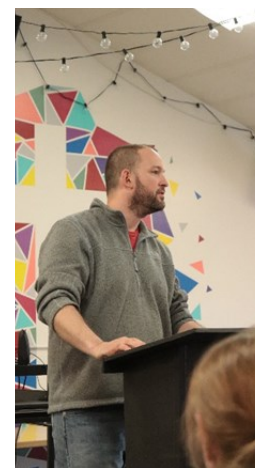

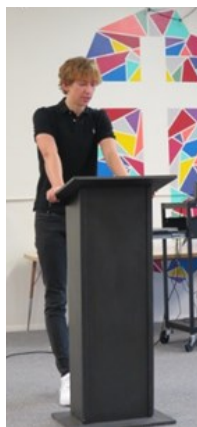
The day we were projected to come back, the roads were closed be-

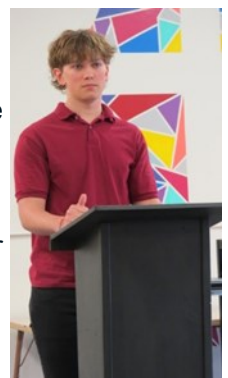
You never know what challenges are ahead, but you do know that God will see you through. Kolden wrapped
