Special speaker for Chapel on September 8th was Mr. Cattell with his shocking story of how he became a Christian. He was raised in a Christian Science home, which they never spoke about Christ but sin being called error. Mary Baker Eddy discovered Christian Science and defined it as the law of God. In their faith, what would happen is, if they got hurt, they would pray for them to heal but if it didn't heal then it meant you were lacking faith. Mr. Cattell told us a story about his friend's brother that broke his leg. some Catholic services but no answers were found. After graduating high school, he left the church. As the years went by, he knew something was missing. He started going to a Presbyterian church in downtown Cleveland and that was



where he felt God. Mrs. Cattell walked into Mr. Cattell's life but he was still not a Christian. One day he was talking to his, now father-in-law, Dean - keep in mind that Dean would let everyone around him know about Christ. During a discussion, Dean asked him, "What would happen if there was no
