30/2 step which is when you push down on their chest 30 times then blow twice through their mouth. You never know how long you will need to do it, so be prepared and know that you might break ribs. An important thing to look out for is that infants, teenagers, and adults need a differ-

ent type of CPR. For example, infants are so small that you should only use two fingers with teenager you start with your hand but don't go down all the way, with adults you make sure you are using enough pressure to make it work. Connie also explained
