


Jasiah's Chapel By Braden Ewing

Lustre Dominates Glendive's Wibaux Invitational By Jasiah Hambira

After much delay, the Lustre Lions track and field team finally got a chance to compete. Our Lions took the trip down to Glendive, Montana, and were

definitely ready to compete. It was a beautiful sunny day with a cool breeze. Braden Ewing placed 8th in the 100-meter dash with a time of 12.27 seconds. In the 200 meters, Jasiah Hambira took second place with a time of 23.92 for a PR. He also took second in the 400-meter dash with a time of 53.22, which is a PR for him. Terran Joseph placed 10th with a time of 25.39. In the 110-meter high hurdles,

Johnslee Pierre took second place with a time of 17.59. Pierre also got fourth in the 300-meter hurdles with a time of 44.46. The 4x1 relay, made up of Braden Ewing, Byron Ewing, Ife Aniobi, and Terran

Joseph, took 8th place. In the long jump, Jasiah Hambira, Terran Joseph, and Johnslee Pierre all placed and qualified for state. Pierre took fourth with

a jump of 20'3.25, Joseph placed third with a leap of 20'4.75, and Hambira took first with a jump of 21'5.75. Pierre also took 8th in the triple jump with a 37'5.5. Hambira took first and qualified for state jumping 42'8.75. Hambira also took first and qualified for state in the high jump soaring over 6'2 to win the event. The Lions placed third with 74 points behind Dawson County and Havre. The

Lustre track team is excited to improve on these marks in the weeks moving forward until state. Go Lions!



National Honor Society by Alexander Chen


On March 26th, 2023, Sunday afternoon, we had ten students that were_ selected to be a part of


NHS; Mana Okamoto lit up the blue candle representing service, and Alexander Chen explained what
