Glendive Meet By Braden Ewing

On Friday, April 7th, the Lustre Christian Varsity track & field team Traveled to Glendive, Montana, for the annual Wibaux Invitational. The boys' team took 3rd overall at the meet. Three out of the ten boys pre-qualified for State in their events. Jasiah Hambira pre-qualified for State in the triple, long and high jumps. Terran Joseph hit the mark for the long jump, and Johnlee Pierre qualified for the long jump- his first time participating in the event. The boys' team did the 4x4 relay, 4x1 relay, and multiple individual events. The team got 3rd overall out of 30 teams.



The Lions look forward to a prosperous rest of the season and hope to win both district and divisional meets. The Lions will have four or five participants in this year's top ten invitational meet in Glasgow, Montana. All the hard work that has been put in so far is evident to see in the results that have been achieved so far. Lions Make Strides at Glasgow Invitational By Jasiah Hambira

Tuesday, April 25th, our Lions made the trip to Glasgow to compete in a makeup meet. This meet was initially scheduled for the beginning of the season, but due to our marvelous weather, they canceled the meet and rescheduled it. To start it off, Terran Joseph placed third in the 100-meter dash with a time of 12.21. Joseph was also a part of the 4x1 relay, and so were Johnlee Pierre, Braden Ewing, and Jasiah Hambira. Those boys ran a time of 45.67, which got them to first-place. Cayden Klatt took 10th place in the mile with a time of 5:51.83. Pierre was leading the way in the hurdles with a first-place finish in the 300-meter hurdles with a time of 42.63 and placed third in the 110-high hurdles with a time

of 19.44.

The Lions also took first in the 4x4 relay with a time of 3:55.31. The participants in that relay were Byron Ewing, Elijah Lenihan, Terran Joseph, and Johnlee Pierre. Klatt also took 7th place in the discus with a toss of 102'1. In the high jump, Diek Olfert placed 5th with a jump of 5'2. Lenihan placed 2nd with a season record of 5'8, and Hambira took first with a season record of 6'3. In the long jump, Joseph placed 8th with a jump of 17'9, and Pierre placed 4th with a leap of 18'07. Ewing took third place with a jump of 19'1.5, and Hambira took second with a jump of 20 feet. Ewing also got third in the triple jump with 38'4, and Hambira took first with a jump of 42'1. With these placings, the boys took firsts in



the meet. We are proud of our Lions and Lady Lions and look forward to supporting them as the season goes on.
