#### From the LCHS AD Randy Reddig (00)

I was asked by the alumni committee to give you a brief summary of the sporting seasons from the last year. There were some very exciting times for Lustre Christian. The basketball season of the 22-23 year kicked off on November 17. Both girls (coached by **Bill Reddig (98)** & **Sadie Brown (19)**) and boys (coached by **Randy Reddig (00)** & Justyn Klatt) had higher goals than the previous year. The boys had a heart breaker the year before to get to state, losing in the Divisional challenge game in overtime. The girls were looking to build off a year that they missed out on making the Divisional tournament. With higher expectations for both teams the seasons got underway. Both teams continued to improve throughout the seasons. The boys finished the regular season 18-0 and the number 1 seed in the District tournament and being ranked #1 in the state C poll for the first time!

The girls entered the District tournament with the 3<sup>rd</sup> seed with an eye on a Divisional tournament berth. The girls entered the District tournament 3<sup>rd</sup>. After a tough road through the tournament, losing in the semis to Scobey and battling their way back. They had the performance of the season in the consolation game, and in dominating fashion advanced to the Divisional tournament. The girls ran into some tough competition at Divisional and after 2 hard fought games, their season came to an end. Very proud of the improvement the girls showed and how they represented LCHS.

The boys entered Districts undefeated and cruised into the championship game and faced the Scobey Spartans. This was the toughest test to date seeing the boys down by as many as 11 points in the fourth quarter. The boys roared back in the last 4 minutes to win Districts by 1 point. This is the first boys' championship at Districts since 2014.

The boys moved on to Divisionals 20-0 with a big target on their back. The competition continued to get better with difficult games at every stage. The opening round the boys were taken to overtime where they finally triumphed by 4. In the semifinals the opponent was the Froid/Lake Redhawks who beat the Lions in the semifinals the year before to push the boys into the loser bracket at Divisionals. The boys remembered the feeling and beat the Redhawks 44-31. This victory set up a rematch with the Fairview Warriors who ended their season the previous year. The Lions looked down and out as the final quarter began with the boys down 11. The boys again kept the faith and roared back and won the Divisional Championship 51-50 in the final moments. The Lions advanced to their first State appearance in school history. State was held in Billings and the fan support was absolutely amazing! There were many comments from other fan bases on the number of people we had supporting us. Alumni came from all over the country and was a great time to catch up with those that played in years past. The boys dropped their first game and then came back to beat Lone Peak in loser out action the second day. The season was ended by Belt, but we all were very proud of the accomplishments of this team ending the season 24-2. More importantly the glory was given to God and we are very thankful for the ride He took us all on!

As soon as State basketball was over, track (coached by Lynn Unrau, **Brooke Toews (00) Holzrichter**, **Becca Unger (00) Reddig**) started the next Monday. The boys track team also went on an unbelievable run. They competed in points at every meet they entered, many times beating most of the class A teams that were competing. The boys went on to win the District and Divisional meets. The boys then competed at the State C meet in Laurel. The first days the boys had a bit of a slow start. The second day ended up being an unbelievable day. The 4x100 relay team of Jasiah Hambira, Braden Ewing, Terran Joseph, and Johnslee Pierre went on to win state. Jasiah Hambira also won the high jump with a jump of 6'-4". Johnslee Pierre won the 300m hurdles with a come from behind run. The boys finished in fourth place just barely out of the trophies. Very proud of these young men.

The 23-24 year began with the girls volleyball team. The Lady Lions had a turnaround season to definitely be proud of. After a couple of difficult years, the girls under the leadership of Mary Zerbe and **Kaitlyn Toavs (18) Brown** had a very successful season. According to Coach Mary, the goals for the year were to "rewrite their volleyball legacy". The ladies achieved this with a "we before me" attitude and they improved throughout the year. The ladies finished with a very good performance at the District tournament winning 2 matches before ending their season with an 8-10 record. Everyone is very proud of the work all involved put in and how they represented LCHS.

We had 3 boys play football with the Wolf Point Wolves. They enjoyed their time and improved immensely throughout the season.
