Pastor Lenihan asked, "What is the difference between a man and a boy?" He stated that this question is what every culture struggles with. He mentioned some cultures with different ways of telling whether someone is a man or a boy. His main example was the Jewish culture, in which they do a Bar Mitzvah, which means "Son of the Commandment." In this, they have a Jewish boy study the Hebrew language, and during this Bar Mitzvah, they must be able to read the Hebrew Commandments completely. If they accomplish this, they will be considered a man.

S = Submit, H = Honor, A = Assess, P = Perish, and E = Engage. Pastor Lenihan went on to explain more about this acronym. He stated that the letter "S," a man who submits, is a man who puts God first in his life. The letter "H" means that a true man is willing to give honor to where honor is due, which means that
