Mr. Mullet's Chapel by Nathan Fast

Chapel's topic this week was Artificial Intelligence (AI), presented by Mr. Mullet. A word of prayer was said, and then he jumped into his message. Mr. Mullet began by stating that he was a self-verified AI expert, so we should all trust him, and also because ChatGPT had verified him. Mr. Mullet then got into his actual points after a good, hearty laugh from the kids. He started off by explaining what AI was. He explained it like this, "AI is computers trained to 'think' and make decisions." They learn patterns from data such as words, images, sounds, and numbers, and he finished with a few examples of the learning process. After this, he gave some of his points, which included: the categorization of different AI's, how AI is a tool that we will most likely use in our future jobs, how it could be beneficial in sharing our faith with those around us, and how people are saying the same things about AI that they were saying about the internet when it first emerged. Another thing Mr. Mullet shared was some of the really great advantages, as well as some of the super unfortunate disadvantages. When he told the room that AI will most likely be in our future jobs, he shared some ways that, that would be the case, how most of the things we do on the internet are using some form of artificial intelligence, when we use Google Translate, we are using it, and others, such as Siri, ChatGPT, Netflix, Spotify, and Google Photos. It can be beneficial for sharing our faith because it provides multiple platforms to detect disease, detect fraud, provide crop management, send messages and emails, translate the Bible, etc.. Some of the advantages of AI, Mr. Mullet gave us were: faster and more accurate learning, personalized learning, accessibility, and, as was previously stated, a way to share the gospel. Some of the disadvantages he stated were: "biased or wrong answers, plagiarism/shortcuts, over-reliance, which weakens thinking, and ethical problems such as privacy, jobs, and deepfakes." Next, he explained AI and a Christian Worldview, which, in my opinion, was his biggest point. He told us that humans are made in God's image, not AI, that tools can reflect

values (good or bad), and that true wisdom comes from God, not machines. Finally, he closed off with a challenge: he told us to "be rooted like our verse for this year, use AI to build, not cheat, use AI to serve, not replace relationships, and AI can write words, but only God can give wisdom." When you see Mr. Mullet in church or at a game, be thankful you aren't the one trying to figure out all the stuff with the computers!
