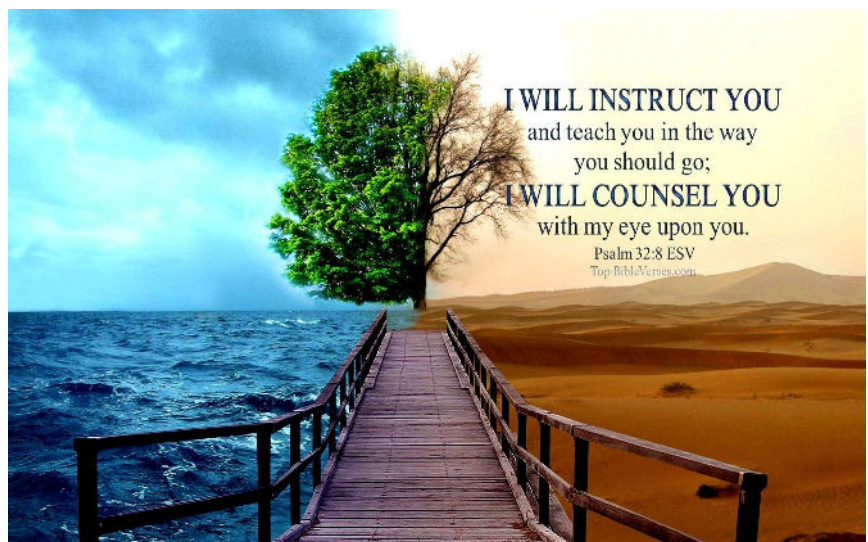
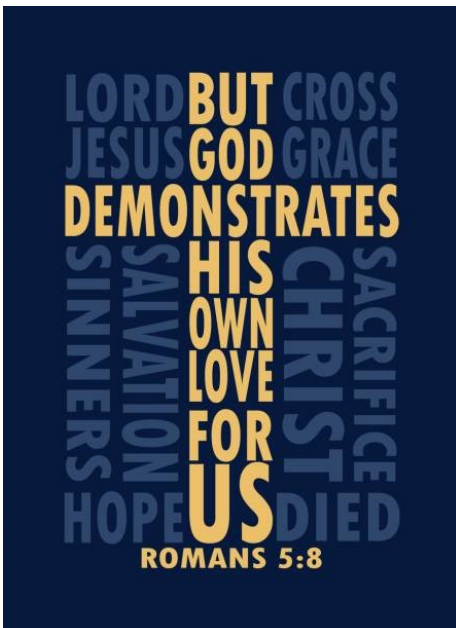


Jeremiah Peters by Andy Ponce-Curl
