Dr. Janzen's Chapel by Nathan Fast

This year's Lustre MB Harvest Festival speaker was the President of Tabor College, Dr. David Janzen. He spoke on Sunday, Monday at the LCHS chapel, and Monday night at church. On Monday, after the 6th period, he came to the chapel and spoke about entrepreneurship, specifically Christian entrepreneurship. A few of his points were: the opportunity to make disciples within a business and through customer and partner relationships, we can earn money to give to missionaries to further Christ's Kingdom, entrepreneurship opens doors to unreached countries and people groups, and it serves people through products and services. After those points, he talked a little bit about how Tabor is upgrading one of their buildings to make a new Business and Entrepreneurship Center. Throughout his whole talk, he explained what entrepreneurship is, to which he came up with these three things. Being an entrepreneur requires being innovative, taking risks, and hope for a future profit. Dr. Janzen then asked the question, "Is God an entrepreneur?" We then went over the points, the first being, is He innovative and creative. Well God created all of these wonderful things such as the earth/ mountains/us/etc. So, the conclusion was, yes, God is creative. The next point was: does God take risks? Well, when he created us, he gave us free will which is a risk, so yes, God takes risks. The last was does God hope for a future profit. If he gives us free will his hope is for the future profit of being with him and the true love that comes with that. The Final Conclusion was, God is indeed an entrepreneur.

Mr. Krehbel's Chapel by Johnlee Pierre

On Monday, October 13, Lustre Christian High School had the chance to listen to Mr. Krehbel, a guest speaker from Omaha, Nebraska. He attended Grace University and was raised in a Christian home, where he grew up learning about Jesus. For chapel He give us some worldview question and explain them. What is missing that I can create? Whose life can I affect, and what seed can I plant? He encourages us to be disciple, which means to follow Jesus and trust who he is. Matthew 4:19 "then he said to them follow me, and I will make you fisher of men. Mr. Krehbel reminded us to let God work in us and to follow Him. HE emphasized that we must be transformed by Christ. As 2corinthians 5:17 Says: therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation: old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new. Our world should be shaped by Jesus, and we are called go out and make disciples. He also spoke about being controlled by the spirit. Galatian 2:20 says: I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ live in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me. Another key point was about taking steps of faith. He shared Romans1:16-17 For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ, for it is the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes, for the Jew first and also for the Greek. For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith to faith; as it is written, "The just shall live by faith." Being a disciple of Jesus means stepping out of you comfort zone completely, even when its hard.

Abigail Curl's Chapel by Andy Curl

On October 14th, my sister, Abigail, took the opportunity to speak to our school during a chapel. Sadly, I was sick at home, but I got to hear what she shared, and I will share it with you all, who weren't able to make it like me. At the start of the chapel, she opened us in prayer and gave a brief introduction of herself and what she has done since high school. Some of the things she has done include 2 missions trips with YWAM (Youth with a Mission), and a trip to India. Abigail's main aspect of her chapel was the story of King Joash, which can be found in 2 Kings and 2 Chronicles, she chose to read from the latter. The story of King Joash starts with the death of the previous King. The mother of the precious king wanted to continue having an heir on the throne, so she sought to kill all the other heirs to the throne. The sister of the previous king took Joash and took him to the house of her and her husband, the priest Jehoiada. Joash remained living with them for 6 years as things slowly deescalated. After 6 years, Jehoiada decided to finally show to the people that Joash was the rightful king. Jehoiada made a covenant with commanders and gathered Levites to come to Jerusalem. The commanders killed the mother of the previous king and Joash was able to rule over the people. After King Joash was put on the throne, he followed Jehoiada and led his people in the way of the Lord. However, when Jehoiada died, King Joash turned in his ways and strayed

away from God. Abigail used this passage to encourage the students about earnestly seeking God in our lives. If we only do good things because we blindly follow our current teachers or spiritual leaders, then we will trail off once we are separated from them. Abigail highlighted the term "sold-out for God" and said that we should be dedicated to God because He is holy. She then went in to emphasize what "Holy" means, God's holiness is what sets Him apart from His creation. God is unlike anything we find on earth or make ourselves; He is far above every one of us. As Christians, we need to make our personal relationship with God our highest priority and make our efforts out of true dedication to God, not out of habit. Abigail shared some ways that she has used to do such as putting a bible passage in your shower to memorize and reflect on. Abigail ended her chapel by sharing some stories of good things have come out of her walk with God, like having previous classmates of hers start attending the church she went to because they wanted to experience the same thing as her. When we truly dedicate our entire lives to God, the people around us notice, and that opens the door for us to share God's Word with them even more. It was great hearing what Abigail had to say and I hope it encourages us all to further strengthen our own lives with God, and to reach out to those around us who do not know Christ.

Neil “Cowboy” Zerbe by Nathan Fast

“Neil is the Corporate Lead Executive for Rockwell Collins Corporation in San Diego. He is responsible for coordinating and supporting all Rockwell Collins Business Areas in support of West Coast/Pacific commands, government agencies and DoD efforts. Neil has worked for San Diego-based defense industry following a distinguished career in the U.S. Navy. As a strike-fighter aviator he made multiple Carrier Strike Group deployments worldwide. During Operation Desert Storm he planned and led air strikes into Iraq, completing 49 combat missions. Neil was also the Air Wing cruise missile planner and C5ISR coordinator. Following Desert Storm, Neil reported to the United States Central Command as Air Operations Branch Chief and cruise missile program manager. He made multiple Joint Task Force deployments beginning with Joint Task Force Southwest Asia (Royal Saudi Air Force HQ, Riyadh, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia).” - Peninsula Community Planning Board) Neil Zerbe started life here in Lustre working for his father, who owned Zerbe Brothers Equipment in Lustre. Mr. Zerbe spent his days erecting farm equipment, such as combines, chisel plows, and others. His dad (Otto) saw Neil one day and talked to him about going somewhere else to do something that was more interesting to him. Mr. Zerbe ended up joining the Navy as a fighter pilot. After training in a few different aircraft he was assigned to the F-14 Tomcat. “The F-

14 Tomcat was a supersonic, twin-engine, two-seat fighter jet that served as the primary air superiority fighter for the U.S. Navy until its retirement in 2006. Known for its variable-sweep wings and powerful engines, it was designed for carrier operations and excelled at both air-to-air combat and ground attack.” -Britannica) When flying the F14, he was assigned the duty to use the new Tomahawk cruise missiles. After his service, it was not his talent in fighter piloting that gave him opportunities, in fact nobody wanted to hire a fighter pilot, because they are notorious for being cocky. It was his expertise in the use of the new Tomahawk missiles, which were one of the first weapons to implement the terrain-contour-matching (TERCOM) and a final "digital scene-matching" guidance system . After going through a few jobs, and meeting some really cool people such as Neil Armstrong. He landed on the job he currently has, which is being a individual consultant. Mr. Zerbe came to the school and talked a little bit about the things he wish he knew before he left Lustre. Most of those things were, the options for different types of jobs that exist. He really emphasized the importance of researching what is out there so you

can be more prepared to leave for college and find a job that you enjoy. Neil currently lives with his wife, Gail E., in San Diego, California. They have two children, Paul and Susana.
