Pastor Frank Brings a Chapel by Hannah Brown



For this chapel it was planned that Pastor Frank Lenihan, from the Mennonite Brethren Church, would come and speak to the students in our high school. Chapel started off as usual with the worship opening with two songs. This day they lead the group in worship with the songs; Mighty to Save and You are Holy. Today was a little different though, because the choir also sang a song. They had been preparing a song, where the song Oceans and King of Kings were combined to make one song, and were finally able to sing it. Once all this was done, it was time for Pastor Lenihan to come and speak.

He opened by talking about how he, Pastor Hathaway, and Mr. Young chose our school verse. He said it was one that popped up in their conversation and was then put into place as this year’s school verse. We then read the entire chapter of Psalms 1 instead of just the verse to get context and the full effect of the text. Next, he continued on to speak on what makes a great speaker and what they should present as they speak. He had three points; I care about my audience, I’m glad I’m here, and I know my material. After this we transitioned into speaking about missions and what are you planning to do once you are out of college. He brought up Josh Brown’s newsletter and read it for all the students to listen

to. In this Josh had written about struggles that he was having in Haiti but also being able to see God work through those hard times. After the letter was done he brought up a video Josh had prepared to explain how he got into missions and to, hopefully, encourage the students in the high school to consider missions as they are graduating in the near future. In the video he told of how he had never thought he could be one of the “super humans” that did missions. But, after meeting a few in college he realized that they were just ordinary people just like us. This made him start to consider missions, specifically in Haiti. To conclude his message, he stuck the thought in the minds of the students of visiting a missionary and saw if it is something God wants them to do in their life.

Ron Olfert was born and raised in the Lustre Community, where his love for aviation started. After high school he attended MSU Northern in Havre and Helena Vo Tech. While at Helena he studied aviation mechanics, which he said, for him, was the most useful mechanic for both farming and mechanics in general. In the year 1968 Mr. Olfert started flying and is still flying to this day. For those of you, like me, who took way too long to do the math, that is 57 years. Something he enjoys doing with his pilots license is called AngelFlight. Angel Flight does many different things such as, medical air transport, fly people to the dentist, fly Christmas gifts to families who might not have the funds for that, fly support dogs, fly cancer survivors to camp, and many other things as well. Angel Flight is not a christian outreach, however they don't limit what the pilots can talk about with their passengers, this then gives an opportunity for a pilot, like Ron, to share the gospel. Ron and Etta also started and currently house the Lustre Ambulance, which is a part of the FMDH Glasgow Hospital. The ambulance crew in Lustre started in the 1980s and we are very thankful for all of the crew, past and present. Ron told me all of this not to brag about what he is doing but simply to encourage us to look for opportunities and use the ones God has given us to share the gospel with those we come in contact with. For God gives us all opportunities every day we just have to be paying attention and listening to him. When asked what his advice for highschoolers is he told me "Don't Fall Asleep", it gets really easy to just live in lustre were most people are christians, where we go to church on Sunday chapel on Thursday, where all of our teachers are Christians, and the people we hang out with. So get into the word for yourselves and get excited about what God shows you, because your excitement in life comes from doing what God tells you to do. Encourage one another, and encouragement doesn't mean telling them what they want to hear but it also means correcting them and helping them. He shared this verse with me which says, "but my righteous one shall live by faith, and if he shrinks back, my soul has no pleasure in him.
